

#### Beloved,

I have been thinking a lot lately about how one is called to use their gifts and graces to build up Christ's Body. What spurred all this was a phone call I got last week. A friend of mine had one of her accounts hacked. This account was tied to everything: debit cards, her calendar, email, and the ability to "lockdown" her computer and cell phone. She felt devastated by this.... and she called and asked for my help. Then, I worked as a mediator between the tech company and her equipment to get her technology back online. Not everyone has the skills or the know-how to walk someone through the menus of a computer system hours away from the other. Here's the point...she is a gifted person in other ways. She has the unique ability to build up people who live on the margins and to create a sense of community.

These two gifts, one technological and one of community-building, are not at odds with each other. We often consult each other, build one another up, and offer our wisdom to one another. Hebrews 10:24-25 says "Let us consider each other carefully for the purpose of sparking love and good deeds. Don't stop meeting together with other believers, which some people have gotten into the habit of doing. Instead, encourage each other, especially as you see the day drawing near."

As your pastor, my role is not just to lead, but also to listen. I am here to hear your wisdom, to understand your needs, and to guide us forward as a church. I am here to help you discern your areas of passion and place you with others who have the gifts to bring forth ministries that speak to those passion areas. Together, we possess the gifts and graces to not only strengthen the body gathered on Sunday mornings but also to transform the world by reaching out to those marginalized within our city. I encourage you to reflect on your own gifts for ministry and to use them as we work together to share the love of God with the world.

In the coming months, our church will be busy with everything from Membership Sunday to the youth mission trip to Vacation Bible School. I want to thank you for the gifts, funds, prayers, and all the ways that you contribute to the work of the church. Please consider how you might further give to the church's needs so that we might continue in our mission. Maybe you can volunteer for VBS; maybe you can bring supplies or offer your prayers; maybe you have the ability to give towards upcoming roof repairs...perhaps, you have the ability to do many things. Please get plugged in! Encourage one another to try something new and different, offer space, to spark love and push one another to transform the world!



Please no Ívory or Jergens soap) One pack of flushable, unscented wipes (42 count) Six laundry detergent sheets placed inside of a small plastic storage bag prior to being added to the kit.
